CATCH STATISTICS FOR THE CANADIAN ALBACORE FISHERY, 1952-1984

Historically, the fishery for albacore (Thunnus alalunga) has been of minor importance to the Canadian (British Columbia) fisheries economy. Landings by Canadian vessels over the past 32 years have fluctuated erratically between 0 and 3558 tonnes for a variety of economic and environmental reasons (see accompanying table and figure). The small catch in 1984 (50 tonnes) is attributed to the low abundance of albacore in areas fished by the Canadian fleet.

Canadian fishermen have traditionally fished albacore with salmon troller-type gear and feathered jigs within 200 miles of the North American coast from central British Columbia (about 52°N Lat.) southward to northern California (about 35°N Lat.). In recent years, a few vessels have fished farther offshore: in 1982, a moderately large vessel (ca 300 G.T.) fished as far west as 178°W Long. and in 1984, two vessels fished in areas 1000 to 1400 miles off the Washington-Oregon coast (135°-150°W Long.).
