## INTRODUCTION

In response to the request of the Sub-Committee on Non-Anadromous Species, at its 1985 Meeting (Doc. 2974, Appendix 2, Section 11(1)(1)), a summary has been prepared of the annual Canadian regulations for non-domestic fisheries, 1977-86. Authority for these regulations is based on the Territorial Seas and Fishing Zones Act, proclaimed January 1, 1977.

## RESULTS

These regulations deal primarily with allocating production surplus to Canadian needs, either for individual national fisheries or for various forms of cooperative fisheries with Canadian industry. The only species involved since 1980 is Pacific hake. The fishery for hake is largely restricted to Management Area 5-2, off southwest Vancouver Island.

Table 1 summarizes the annual allocations, by nation, for each species during 1977-86. In 1986, the total allocation of Pacific hake was 50,000 t -- 20,000 t to Poland and 30,000 t to the USSR. Poland's allotment consisted of 10,000 t to the national fishery, and 10,000 t to Canada-Poland cooperative ventures. The USSR allotment consisted of 15,000 t to the national fishery, and 15,000 t to the Canada-USSR cooperative ventures.
