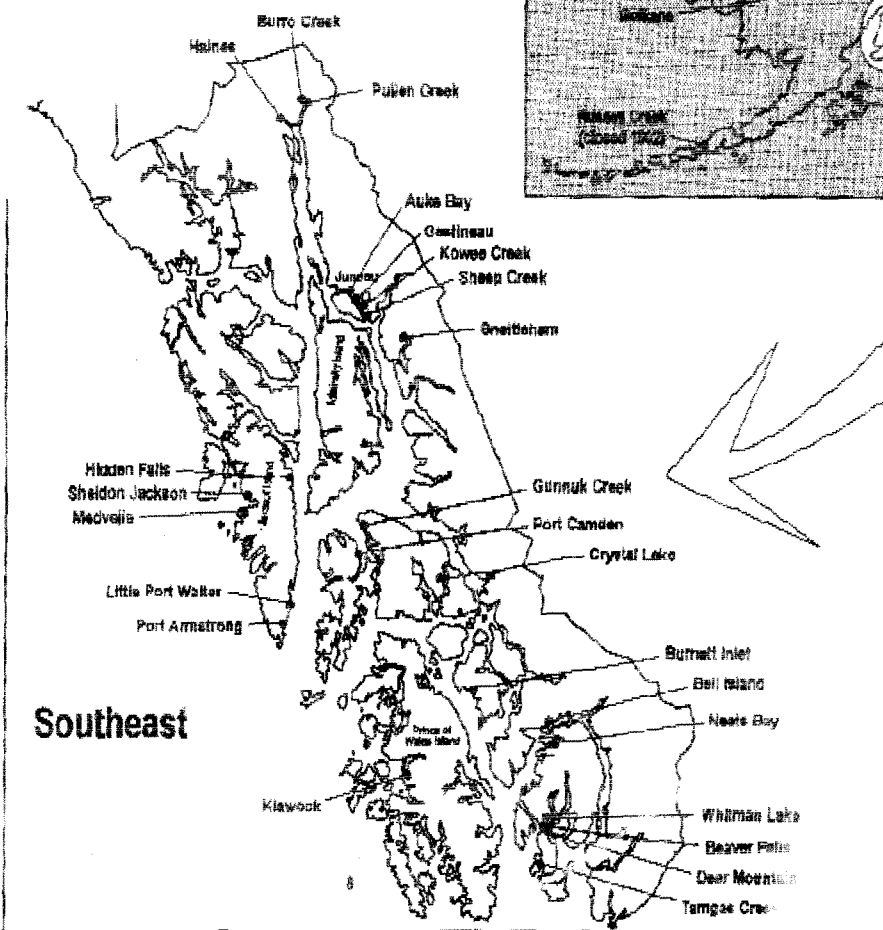
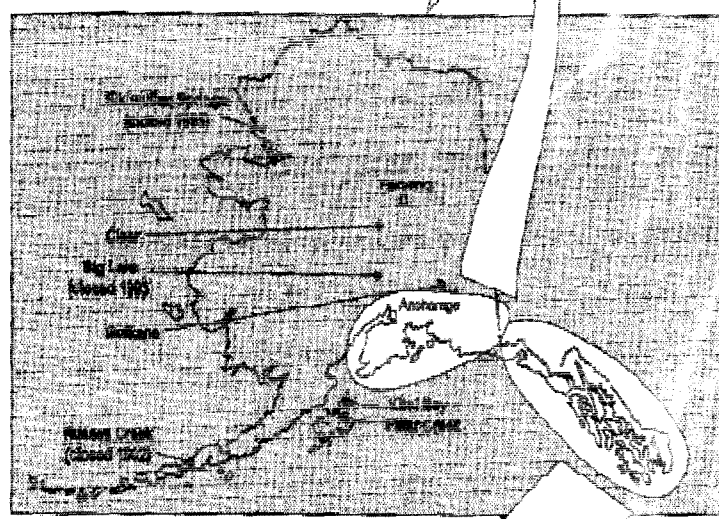
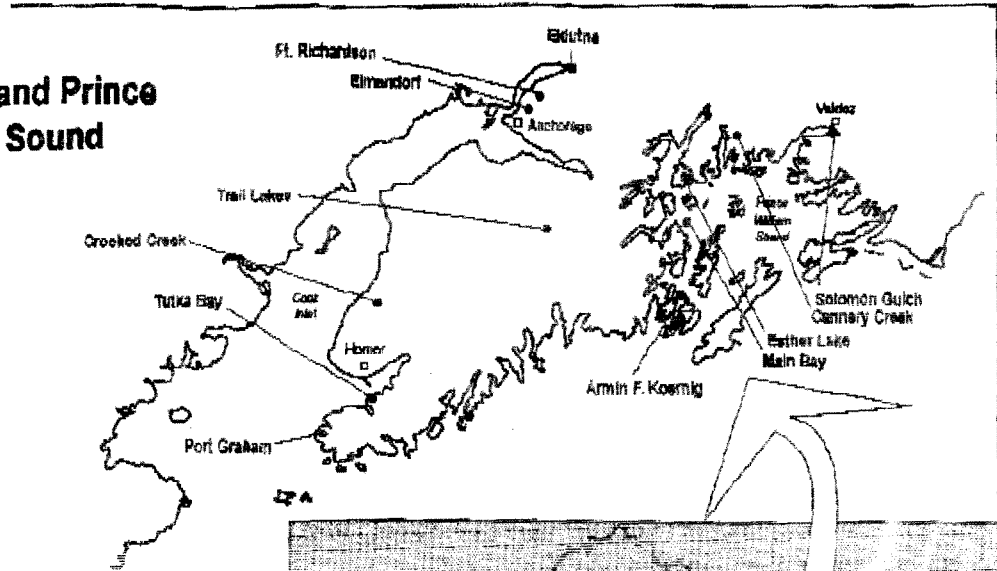
In 1995 there were 31 private nonprofit, 3 federal (including Bureau of Indian Affairs) and 5 state salmon hatcheries operating in Alaska. Most (24) of these hatcheries are located in southeast Alaska. The Cook Inlet/Prince William Sound region has 12 hatcheries, Arctic/Yukon/Kuskokwim region has 1 hatchery and Kodiak region has 2 hatcheries.

Alaskan hatcheries released a total of 1.5 billion fish (*see Table 1*). Approximately 60% of the fish released were pink salmon. Hatcheries in Prince William Sound and Cook Inlet contributed 56% of the fish released.
