Alaska commercial salmon fisheries catch; sport fishery harvest, subsistence and personal use harvest have been reported in NPAFC statistical yearbooks. There are many inconsistencies between Alaska catch data reported in NPAFC statistical yearbooks and Alaska Department of Fish and Game data records. These inconsistencies include reporting areas as well as catch and harvest magnitudes. To correct these inconsistencies, updated catch and harvest statistics are reported in this document.

Tables 1 provide commercial salmon fishery catch statistics in numbers, by area and species, consistent with data records maintained by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game for the years 1992 to 2002. Table 2 provides catch statistics in metric tons.

Alaska subsistence and personal use harvest statistics are presented by area, and species, for years 1992 – 2002 in Table 3. These are consistent with the data records maintained by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G 2003).

Updated sport fishery harvests are in Table 3.
